Getting Started

A PSD file is layered to easily modify the image file. It contains all the sources. To manage files of this type you need Adobe Photoshop software installed on your computer. You can do any kind of customization using Adobe Photoshop because this powerful tool allows you to change text, image colors, or add your own photos and save the optimized image.

The first step to managing your PSD file is to open it with Adobe Photoshop. It's quite easy. To open the PSD file you should select **"File/Open"** from the top of the menu and browse to the location of your PSD file. A more simple way to open the file is to drag-and-drop it from your file browser to your Adobe Photoshop window. Also, if the PSD files on your computer are associated with Photoshop software, you can just double click it in your file browser and it will be opened and ready to use.

Note: If you see an alert message that says **"Some layers contain fonts that are missing"**, it means that you have not installed all the fonts needed in this item.

Adding Images

You can add your own image to PSD file in very simple way. Just drag and drop it from file browser to your Adobe Photoshop window. Or you can use **"File/Open..."** form the top menu. Your image will appear in separate window of Adobe Photoshop program. You can do prior modifications there. For

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example you can crop it using crop tool (hotkey **"C"**) or make some color adjustments to make image fit the color scheme selecting **"Image/Adjustments/Colour Balance..."** from the top menu.

Next step – is to move your image to PSD window. To do it select move tool from tools panel or use **"V"** hotkey. Then drag and drop image using that tool to your window of Adobe Photoshop.

Now you can move that image to the right location using same tool. If image that you've just inserted overlapped by other images or text you should move it upper in layers list. Go to layers list panel and drag and drop this layer up until overlapping disappears.

Adding / Editing Text

When your PSD source file already opened in Adobe Photoshop, press **"T"** key to use type tool. Click with type tool cursor the text you want to edit. If "The following fonts are missing..." message will appear it means that you have not installed all fonts needed to modify text. If appearing message says "Editing or rendering the text layer..." never mind it, everything will be editable without any problems.

If your text field should contain several rows, you can start typing from the new line by pressing **"Shift + Enter"**.

You can quit editing mode by pressing **"Ctrl + Enter"**. If you want to discard all editing changes press **"ESC"** key to quit editing and undone all changes.

If you want to change some of text attributes such as font family, style or color do the following. Select text which properties you want to modify. Then go to the options panel at the top of the screen. If you can't see it for any reason, show that panel by selecting **"Window/Options"** from top menu.
